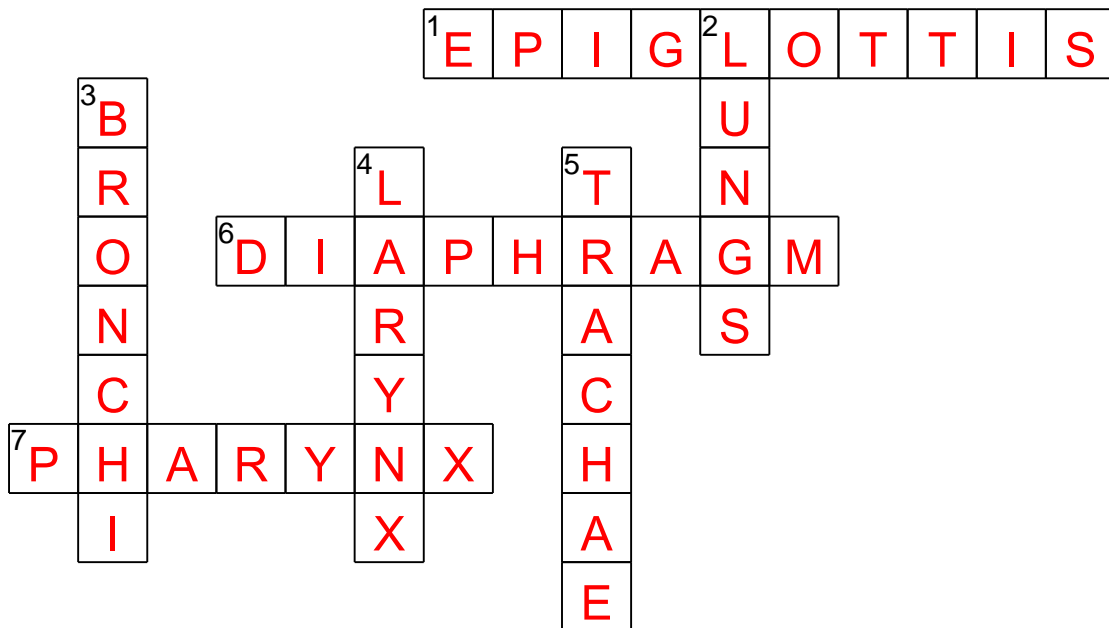

ACROSS

- prevents food and liquid from entering the trachea during swallowing.
- principle muscle of respiration that separates the chest from the abdomen.
- a passage that leads from the cavities of the nose and mouth to the larynx and esophagus. Air passes through the pharynx to our lungs, and food enters the esophagus through the pharynx.

DOWN

- a pair of breathing organs located with the chest. The function is to transport oxygen to the blood and remove carbon dioxide
- are large air tubes leading from trachea to the lungs that pass on air to and from the lungs.
- located between the pharynx and the trachea and houses vocal cords.
- airway through which respiratory air passes in organisms
